Treasure boxes



Can you go on a hunt around your house to find treasure for your box?

You will need an empty egg box and good 'spotting' eyes.

You may choose to find treasure that is all the same colour. (For example, all items found are red.)

You may choose to find different amounts of treasure and sequence these in order from 1-6. (See the photo as an example).

Talk about all the items of treasure you are putting in your box. The shape, size and amount. Question whether some items are too big to fit in.

Talk about what you do with it, what material it is made of etc.

Make it easier: Choose any items that will fit inside your treasure box.

Make it harder: Choose items that begin with the same sound. For example: 'd' for dinosaur, dice, duck.
