SINGL USE PLASTIC STRATEGY

The aim of our single-use plastic (SUP) strategy is simple. Where feasible, we want to make Solihull a SUP free authority by the end of 2020.

Whilst there are a number of definitions, we are adopting the following broad

"SUP includes all products that are made wholly or partly of plastic and are typically intended to be used just once and/or for a short period of time before being disposed of, for example, takeaway boxes, disposable coffee cups, stirrers, plastic wrap, polystyrene packaging and cigarette filters." (1)

### WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

The UK uses 5 million tonnes of plastic a year, nearly half of which is packaging (2). Whilst plastic is a significant contributor to the UK economy and as a material it is incredibly useful, if leaked into the environment its durability ensures it remains for hundreds, if not thousands of years. Too often it is not recycled and ends up littering the streets or polluting the natural environment.

Whilst our aim is to eliminate SUP there are some practical issues to consider:

- Lack of adequate sorting infrastructure currently in UK
- Lack of end markets and lack of incentives to buy recycled plastic over new plastic
- Lack of catering/food companies that supply food in sustainable/non-plastic packaging

### THE NATIONAL CONTEXT

The Government has set out its ambition in its strategy 'Our Waste, Our Resources: A Strategy for England(2).

This sets out how they will preserve our stock of material resources by minimising waste, promoting resource efficiency and moving towards a circular economy. This will support the elimination of avoidable plastic waste over the lifetime of the Government's Environmental

Key targets and ambitions are contained within these, and include:

- All plastics on the market being recyclable, reusable or compostable by 2025
- Eliminate avoidable waste of all kinds by 2050

Other emerging proposals (5) include:

- Moving the cost of disposal to producer reform of waste packaging regulations
- Encouraging use of recycled plastic through taxation
- Encourage recycling introduce deposit scheme for drinks containers
- Simplify recycling across the country introduce a consistent set of recyclables
- Drive resource efficient product design standards for ecodesign

## WHAT IS OUR APPROACH TO THE PROBLEM?

In delivering our strategy we will:

- Adopt an evidence based approach based on a clear understanding of our procurement activity.
- Follow the waste hierarchy of reduce, reuse, recycle. Meaning where possible we will eliminate or reduce use. If that is not possible we will look to see if there are any ways we can encourage people to reuse plastic items and finally we will look to ensure the item is recycled (or at least made from recycled material to encourage these markets).
- Work collaboratively with our suppliers to reduce the amount of SUP procured.
- Take an innovative approach, learning from best practice and partners.
- Not only work to 'put our own house in order' but also play our part in encouraging others to do the same.

### WHAT SUP ARE WE CURRENTLY USING?

We undertook an audit which revealed that over 1.5 million items are used and then disposed of. The top five included those we expected, such plastic cutlery, food packaging, cups and lids, but also less obvious ones such as gloves. More detail of the audit can be found in the SUP Summary of Audits.

#### WHAT ARE WE ALREADY DOING?

Encore Café have replaced SUP glasses with reusable ones, installed a water fountain and signed up as 'water bottle refill station, use metal cutlery and takeaway wooden disposable cutlery, and serve drinks with paper straws. In the Council House plastic cups are no longer supplied, and where disposable cups are offered in public areas, they are paper. In other areas such as Sans Souci Training Centre, hot beverages are served in biodegradable paper cups. Procurement Team consider the reduction of SUP and unnecessary packaging when tendering for contracts. 'Dry mixed recycling' is collected at schools and Council offices for recycling. The remaining waste is sent to a local energy from waste plant. Love Solihull work with schools and community groups, including organising a 'Blue Planet' plastic competition.
